## Pastor's Message

"I love to tell the story... of Jesus and his love." (ELW #661)

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

What is your faith story? We each have stories from our faith journey – moments of grace and experiences of God's healing and redemptive work in our lives. At the Sierra Pacific Synod Assembly in June, the keynote speaker, Pastor Rebecca Anderson, talked about story-telling as a way of sharing the gospel. She used "story prompts" – strips of paper with a sentence to complete – to give us a taste of story-telling, and if you attended worship on the third or fourth Sunday of June here at Faith, you got to experience story prompts. If you missed them, here they are for your reflection:

- It wasn't what I had imagined when...
- I had to walk by faith when...
- One of the most frightening storms I have ever been in was when ...

I plan to use story prompts again later this summer, to get us thinking about and sharing our faith stories. Perhaps you have a "God story" you would be willing to share during worship; if so, please let me know!

I am excited to be studying Genesis in our Wednesday Bible study. We started out comparing the creation account in Genesis chapter 1 with the Babylonian creation account, *Enuma Elish*. What a difference between them! Our Bible has a better story to tell about God's gracious intentions in creation!

The world tells us many stories – that "might makes right" and violence solves problems; that we aren't good enough and need many various products to improve ourselves; that the "other side" is totally to blame; that "rugged individualism" is our best life and each person should pull themselves up by their own bootstraps. But we have a better story to tell in Jesus Christ our Lord, the story of grace and forgiveness and community and flourishing for all people and the whole earth. The world needs our stories of God's love more than ever.

If you are traveling this summer, I encourage you to visit a local worship service wherever you are. It is good to hear the gospel proclaimed in a different voice and a different setting, and helps us to grow in our connection as the body of Christ in the world. May you be blessed with rest, renewal, and growth in faith this summer... and maybe bring back a story to share.
